Forming Your WholeHearted Learning

Forms will not make you a better homeschooling parent. Some states mandate record-keeping, and you must fill out required forms. However, the personal habit of forms-keeping is not an inherent factor in homeschool success. Those who love keeping forms will probably think those who do not are minimizing something important; those who love *not* keeping forms will probably think those who do are emphasizing something unimportant. Though there are some very good arguments for keeping some forms, the truth is that you can form a well-educated, mature child without forms. Forms are just tools you can use—if you need them, they can help; if you don't, they may not be necessary.

We don't major on forms for two reasons. First, we don't want a form to become a substitute for your instincts as a parent and home educator. WholeHearted Learning is about liberating learning, not formulizing it. Second, forms are very personal and, by their nature, inflexible. That's why we encourage you to make your own forms to reflect your family's priorities and practices. Even if you are not naturally a forms-keeper, here are some good reasons for you to consider forming the habit of keeping a few good forms.

- **Records** — If a state educational or social worker ever questions your homeschooling, good records will become your ally.
- **History** — It's nice to keep a history of what you have studied and done. Your kids will enjoy looking back.
- **Motivation** — A book-reading form can become a motivational tool for reading, especially when milestones are added.
- **Creativity** — If you keep your forms in binders, let your children create a colorful cover insert, decorate the section dividers, and provide other artistic touches.
- **Projects** — Forms for your children can become homeschooling projects. For example, create a My 24 Family Ways binder for each child.
- **Organization** — A simple form or two can help you stay better organized in the flood of homeschooling papers.
- **Planning** — Forms for planning your school year can help you get on track and stay on track in a busy season.
- **Accountability** — In the absence of other people in your life, a simple form can help you stay accountable to your goals.

Go Form It!

Whether you write on forms or write off forms, there is a good argument to be made for the educational value of form making and keeping. Getting your children involved in designing forms that they or your family will use engages them creatively and can give them a sense of accomplishment. Consider how form making can engage your children on several levels of learning:

- **Purpose** — defining a reason for the form that will guide the process of creating it
- **Logic** — determining what information should and should not be gathered
- **Organization** — considering priority of form elements and flow of information intake
- **Spatial Reasoning** — assigning sufficient space for each element of the form
- **Design** — creating an efficient design for gathering and retrieving the information
- **Art** — creating an attractive design with graphics, icons, photos, and more

Getting In-Formed

Computers excel at form design and creation. Word processors, page layout programs, and productivity software packages are the best places to start. They typically include many customizable form templates, form creation tools, and downloadable online resources. There are also good online suites. Once you and your kids get the right tools and get the hang of design, you'll become form-making pros in no time. And if you want to share your form with others, just print it as a PDF and pass it around. Your friends will soon be saying, "Good form!" Following are some good tools to get forming:
